Student Resource Packet for Teaching Literacy Program, Long Island

The NYSUT Education and Learning Trust and Touro College currently collaborate to offer a Master's degree program in Teaching Literacy, Birth – Grade 12 (36 cr.) The program is designed for part-time study and typically requires two years to complete. Students completing the program will be eligible for the Literacy, Birth to Grade 6 certification and the Literacy, Grades 5-12 certification.

The first eighteen credit hours are completed through the NYSUT Education and Learning Trust (ELT) at the Trust's current tuition rate. ELT semester course offerings can be found at <http://eltweb.nysut.org/iqweb/Visitor/ConEdCourseSearch.asp>. These courses will be offered primarily at the Levittown Teachers Center.

Students must provide proof of immunization to the college at the beginning of the program. Information about the required documentation is available at <http://www.touro.edu/registrar/immunization.asp>.

Students then complete the remaining credit hours for the master's degree through the Graduate School of Education & Psychology, Touro College at the current discounted Touro College tuition rate. Semester course offerings can be found at <http://www.touro.edu/general/gsep.asp>. These courses are offered online.

NOTE: CURRICULUM CHANGE BEGINNING FALL 2006: COURSE EDUC 618 AND COURSE EDUC 619 WILL BE COMBINED INTO ONE COURSE AND A NEW 3-CREDIT COURSE WILL BE ADDED TO SPECIFIC PEDAGOGICAL CORE. PROGRAM WILL STILL REQUIRE 36 HOURS TO COMPLETE.

Specific Admissions Requirement, Teaching Literacy:

Only certified teachers may enroll in this program.

Practicum

All program Students must complete the hours specified in the college’s “Student Guide to Practicum: EDSE 692 and 693” – contact the program regional coordinator in your area to obtain this packet:

Program Students must have completed 24 credits prior to beginning the practicum: the General Pedagogical Core (18 credits) plus 6 credits from the Specific Pedagogical Core.

ALL OTHER COURSES MUST BE COMPLETE PRIOR TO COMPLETING PRCTICUM II.

Students may document 40 hours from course work completed earlier in the program toward completion of the total practicum hours requirement.

Requests for Transfer Credit

Students who have completed graduate course work at other institutions prior to beginning the program should include a written request for a transfer credit evaluation with the application for admission.

Students who are already enrolled in the program and seek to transfer course work into the program should contact the program chair, Elaine Nikolakakos at enikolakakos@touro.edu.

To Register for Online Specific Pedagogical Core Courses

Students in the Literacy program register for online courses on the college web site, following the “Procedures for Non-Matriculated Students”, under the Graduate School of Education and Psychology, Graduate School Online.

Students should contact the program chair during the semester in which they are completing the first 18 credits. Registration for Specific Pedagogical Core courses is done prior to the start of the semester in which courses are being offered and students must register early.

Candidate Grade Reports and Official Transcripts

Students in the program can obtain student copies of their course grades by visiting the Touro College web site at www.touro.edu. You will need your Touro College ID number to complete this process. Students can view their ELT course history by visiting the Trust’s web site at <https://eltweb.nysut.org/iqweb/secure/logon.asp>.

To obtain an official transcript, please follow the instructions at <http://www.touro.edu/general/transcripts.asp>. On the transcript request form, please specify the courses from the most recent semester that should be included on your transcript.

Program Completion and Graduation

Please submit your completed Application for Graduation (ask your regional coordinator for this form) in the semester prior to the semester in which you plan to graduate. Once all grades are posted and the college has verified that you have completed all program requirements, the college will forward your application to the State Education Department, Office of Teaching Initiatives. This is normally 1-2 months **AFTER** your official date of graduation.

While the college can recommend you for certification by verifying that you have completed a registered graduate program, you are responsible for all other certification requirements, such as Teacher Certification Examinations (NYSTCE) and work experience verification.
